Catch up Premium 2020-21

The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds.

School allocations are calculated on a per pupil basis.

Mainstream schools will get £80 for each pupil in from reception to year 11 inclusive. Schools will get funding in 3 tranches:

Autumn 2020 – this is based on the latest available data on pupils in mainstream schools.

Spring 2021 – based on updated pupil and place data. This payment will also take account of the initial part payment made in autumn 2020 so that schools will receive a total of £46.67 per pupil.

Summer 2021 term - a further £33.33 per pupil.

We will

use this funding for specific activities to support our pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months, in line with the curriculum expectations for the Summer term and next academic year.
