

## Isolation Learning for Key Stage 1

If your child has to stay at home due to being a close contact with someone who has COVID, or has to follow isolation rules, we have provided some home learning ideas for them to do at home.

<b>Year 2</b>	<b>Week beginning: 24<sup>th</sup> January</b>
<b>English</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Choose one of your favourite stories and think about the <b>setting</b>, where it takes place. Can you use some adjectives to describe it?</li> <li>Find out what a <b>savannah</b> is. Where do you find a savannah? Use adjectives to describe it as a setting.</li> <li>Describe some different African animals. Can you use verbs, adjectives and nouns?</li> </ul>
<b>Maths</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A pictogram shows how many different objects there are. Can you make a pictogram to show how many toys you have at home?</li> <li>Some pictograms have different scales, for example 1 block might represent 2 rather than 1. Can you make a pictogram using a different scale? <b>Topic</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Choose 2 different animals. What is their habitat? Where do they live? Why do they live there? How is that animal suited to live there? Can you draw or make a habitat background for your favourite animal?</li> </ul>

<b>Year 1</b>	<b>Week beginning: 24<sup>th</sup> January</b>
<b>English</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This week we are looking at the digraphs <b>wh (when)</b>, <b>ph (alphabet)</b>, <b>ie (tie)</b>. Look for words that have these in your reading books. Can you sound them out?</li> <li>• Try to write some of the words and sound button them.</li> <li>• Can you write a sentence using some of the words you find?</li> <li>• Read one of your favourite stories to a grown up.</li> <li>• Find some facts about Saturn, Uranus or Neptune. Use your sentence skills to write a sentence about each planet. Can you draw a picture too?</li> </ul>
<b>Maths</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use a ruler or a number line to do some subtraction calculations. Remember to jump backwards to take away! Find the answers to these calculations:</li> <li>• <math>19 - 5 =</math>                      <math>13 - 2 =</math>                      <math>17 - 4 =</math></li> <li>• <math>20 - 6 =</math>                      <math>18 - 10 =</math>                      <math>16 - 5 =</math></li> </ul>
<b>Topic</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Smell</b> and <b>taste</b> are 2 of our senses. Practise using these at home!</li> <li>• <b>Smell</b> – ask a grown up to find some things for you to smell without looking. Write or draw what you think they might be. Were you right? What is your favourite smell?</li> <li>• <b>Taste</b> – ask a grown up to find you some things to taste without looking. Can you guess what they are? Find something that tastes <i>sour</i> or <i>sweet</i>. What is your favourite thing to taste? Can you try some new food this week that you haven't tasted before?</li> </ul>
