
Dear Parents/Carers,



to their learning. Along with other members of the leadership team then I have been focusing attention on English over the last few weeks.



Year two produced some amazing story writing last week. Mrs Cleary and I loved watching them turn their plans into actual stories. It is great to see them showing more and using some great noun phrases, different punctuation and adjectives to keep the reader interested.
